Prime Lambs		
A good-sized yarding of mixed quality lambs sold well, with the better lines attracting strong competition throughout. The top price of \$331 was achieved on the day, with B McAulay, Lincoln, topping at \$312 for their 10 head making \$280–\$312, and Tarahau Ltd, Prebbleton, presenting the largest line at 62 head selling from \$211–\$301. JRW & NB Hiatt, Cheviot, also performed strongly at \$256–\$298 for their pen, while WI Esson, Ellesmere, returned \$288–\$296 and BJ & SN Butters, Oxford, made \$239–\$270 for their 25 head. Okuku Farm, Oxford, sold the second largest line at 67 head making \$200–\$229, and Fitzallan Park, Southbridge, returned \$245–\$261 for their 50 head. Prime Sheep		
A good quality yarding of prime sheep sold very well, with prices rising in value compared to the previous few weeks. The top price of \$378 was achieved for prime ewes, with SJ Davison, Diamond Harbour, making \$310 and Black Gate Farming, Omhi, selling two lines strongly including 32 ewes and wethers reaching \$314. WD & MR Cullen, Homebush, returned \$184–\$290 for their 16 ewes, while Daly Farms, Cheviot, sold 34 head from \$198–\$272 and Ben Nevis Partnership, Hanmer, made \$234–\$250 for their 30 head. Rams sold well with the top at \$184, heavies making \$150–\$184, mediums \$120–\$150 and lights \$100–\$120. Prime Cattle		
Prime cattle sold to strong results at Canterbury Park yesterday, with steers and heifers both finding excellent demand. Steers topped at \$3,136 with Charnbrook, West Melton, while Stony Bay Point, Akaroa, sold 8 steers from \$2,955, with the pen averaging \$4.80–\$5.20/kg. Heifers also sold well with A R & M J Sykes, Brookside, the standout at \$3,098 for their 15 head making \$4.70–\$5.21/kg, while Charnbrook returned \$3,367 and Barnett Trust, Woodend, made \$2,683. Cows were limited with Rob & Mel Ruck, Waikari, achieving \$3.88/kg for their 2 head. Store cattle also sold strongly with steers making \$5.00–\$5.20/kg and heifers \$4.95–\$5.18/kg, with JB & CN McDermott, Prebbleton, topping at \$2,270 and D & D Galletly, Waiau, selling steers and heifers from \$1,270–\$1,400.
