Prime Lambs		
Prime lambs sold to steady competition, with T J & F M Burrows topping the market at \$340, followed by Wilfield Limited with 15 lambs at \$338 and 5 lambs at \$322. Other strong lines included C J & B J Parker with 8 lambs at \$328, R D J Samuels with 10 lambs at \$307, and Long Meadows with 23 lambs at \$304. Prime Sheep		
Prime sheep met steady demand, with L J Lye topping the ewe section at \$276. Glendhu Farm sold 18 ewes at \$226 and 7 ewes at \$194, while Wendrum Farm sold ewes at \$298. Prime Cattle		
PRIME STEERS Prime steers sold to solid demand, with well-finished cattle continuing to attract strong competition. Wild Family Trust topped the section at \$3,258 for a Hereford steer, while R N & D F Leslie sold Angus steers to \$3,128 and \$2,910 per head. Ben Winters sold a Simmental steer for \$3,073, with the better-finished steers generally trading from 491c/kg to 524c/kg. Top Price - \$3,258 Steer Range - \$2,005 - \$3,25		

PRIME HEIFERS

Prime heifers met steady competition, with quality cattle attracting the strongest interest. J A Ranby topped the section at \$2,859, while Ben Winters sold a Hereford heifer for \$2,816 and M F & J M Greenwood sold Angus heifers to \$2,770. S A R & M J Sykes sold the larger lines, returning from \$2,216 to \$2,319 per head, with most heifers trading from 467c/kg to 512c/kg.

PRIME COWS & BULLS

A small offering of cows and bulls came forward. L N & G A Climo topped the cow section at \$3,434, with a second cow returning \$2,506. The sole bull of the sale was offered by Lindsay Griffin, selling for \$2,699 at 482c/kg.

Store Cattle

Store cattle sold to good competition, with demand strongest for well-bred weaner and yearling cattle. The top sale of the day was a line of 4 Hereford heifers from With a Nose for Quality at \$2,500, while further Hereford heifers from the same vendor sold to \$2,190. Strong competition was also seen for Angus and Angus X cattle, with JA Ranby's 8 Angus steers selling for \$1,970 and 8 Friesian steers at \$1,690. Larger lines of Angus and Hereford heifers generally sold from \$950 to \$1,810, while lighter cattle eased accordingly.
