PRIME STEERS Prime steers sold to a strong trade, with the heavier Angus and Hereford steers attracting solid competition throughout. P N L & T J Wright had a strong sale at \$5.44/kg, while Millar Family Partnership also sold Angus steers at \$5.44/kg. R D & L J Potts sold Speckle Park X steers to \$5.41/kg, with Phil & Robyn Little returning \$5.32/kg and \$5.31/kg for their Angus Friesian X steers. Steers - \$4.31 - \$5.57/kg PRIME HEIFERS Prime heifers sold to excellent competition, with quality Angus and Angus X heifers keenly sought after. P N L & T J Wright and Glenlea Partnership shared the top price at \$5.46/kg, while Kevin Mounce sold Angus heifers to \$5.44/kg. Store Cattle

Store cattle sold to good competition, with the stronger Charolais and Angus X cattle attracting the most interest. P N L & T J Wright topped the market at \$2,370 for Charolais X steers averaging 443kg, while a line of Charolais X heifers from the same vendor sold to \$2,200. C England sold Angus X heifers at \$2,170, while P N L & T J Wright's Hereford heifers made \$1,950. Lighter cattle sold in line with current values, with Greg Payne's Speckle Park cattle making \$1,450 and Tamakehu Lifestyle's Belted Galloway heifers returning \$1,460.
