



### Prime Lambs

A strong yarding of prime lambs sold to excellent demand throughout the sale, with the top end of the market performing particularly well and ewe lambs stealing the show. TJ & FM Burrows were the standout vendor of the day with multiple lines making \$272–\$336, their 11 ewe lambs topping at \$336 — the best price of the sale across all lines. DS & JC Fraser also achieved a sharp result with 9 prime lambs making \$324, while Breezemere Limited returned a strong \$300 for their 25-head line and TD Gilbert sold two pens from \$300–\$309. Meadows Ranch, WD & MR Cullen and M & M Stanley all contributed well-presented lines making \$290–\$298, \$238–\$290 and \$244–\$293 respectively. Okuku Farm Ltd presented the largest drafts of the sale with 109 head across multiple lines making \$234–\$238, while D & K Rowell sold three lines from \$206–\$274 and James Sommerville returned \$243–\$278 across 26 head.

### Prime Sheep

A solid yarding of prime ewes, rams and 2th ewes sold to good demand throughout the sale, with the better-quality lines attracting strong competition. Scott Manderson topped the prime ewe section at \$308, with Wilfield Limited also performing strongly across three lines making \$241–\$288 and Hamilton Glens Partnership selling well at \$245–\$248 for their 34-head draft. R J & LF Bell returned a solid \$256 for their 4 prime ewes, while Te Oka Farms Ltd presented a good run of lines making \$152–\$218 across prime and 2th ewes. The 2th ewe lines sold well with Te Oka Farms Ltd topping at \$202 for their 24-head pen and R A Wolfe's wether achieving a sharp \$314. Rams sold to a good trade with TJ & FM Burrows topping at \$200, WJ Hawker making \$158 and J Millichamp's 2 prime ewes returning a tidy \$224.

### Prime Cattle

Prime cattle sold to excellent results at Canterbury Park today, with a well-presented yarding of steers and heifers attracting strong competition throughout. Steers were the standout of the sale, with Duthie Farm topping at \$5.19/kg on their 4-head pen of Hereford steers averaging 567.5kg, while Kennethmont Farms Trust were the major vendor with multiple Angus lines making \$5.08–\$5.13/kg. G McKenzie also performed strongly with Speckle Park X steers returning \$5.01–\$5.07/kg, and MH & AJ Galvan's heavy Hereford X steers averaging 755kg made a solid \$4.99/kg. Heifers also sold to a pleasing trade, with G McKenzie's Speckle Park X heifer topping the category at \$5.06/kg, and Harvest Trust and Harrington Partnership both returning \$5.04–\$5.05/kg on well-finished Charolais lines. Kennethmont Farms Trust again featured strongly in the heifers with Angus lines making \$4.85–\$4.91/kg. Cows were limited with JA Aitcheson making \$3.70–\$3.82/kg, while MT Bengier Limited's Shorthorn bull rounded out the sale at \$3.50/kg on a 930kg beast.
